Researchers like Liesa Reitz embedded English as a Foreign Language (EFL) learning into a 3D Cooperative VR Game. This innovative approach enhances communication skills and fosters confidence. VR simulations create authentic training environments, making language learning engaging and effective. The game aligns with the Graded Examination in Spoken English (GESE) Trinity Exam, promising a dynamic learning experience beyond traditional classrooms (Reitz et al., 2019, p. 812).

Beyond its role in experiential learning, VR offers a myriad of advantages in language education. By immersing students in simulated real-world environments, VR cultivates a sense of engagement and motivation, driving active participation in language acquisition. Moreover, VR enables personalized learning experiences, catering to individual learning styles and preferences, thus fostering a deeper understanding of linguistic concepts.

Several VR tools have emerged as invaluable assets in the language learning landscape. Platforms such as Google Expeditions (*Google expeditions*, n.d.), Avakin Life, and Mondly VR offer immersive experiences tailored to language learners' needs, encompassing cultural exposure, vocabulary acquisition, and realistic language scenarios (7 top VR language learning apps in 2023 | fluentu language learning blog, n.d.). These tools empower educators to create dynamic and interactive learning environments, thereby enriching the language learning journey for students.
